Holy Week and Easter Liturgies at St. Christina

PALM SUNDAY – Sunday, March 24th

Christian communities celebrate Palm Sunday, marking the beginning of Holy Week, the most sacred time of year for Christians. Palm Sunday recalls the story in Christian Scripture of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, greeted by people waving palm branches. Palms are blessed and distributed at all the Masses. It is a reminder for Christians to welcome Jesus into their hearts and to be willing to follow him. The service on Palm Sunday also includes a reading of the Passion, the story of the suffering and crucifixion of Jesus.

SACRED TRIDUUM – Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil/Easter

The Easter Triduum begins with the Vigil of Holy Thursday. It marks the end of the forty days of Lent. The Sacred Paschal Triduum is the three most solemn days of the liturgical year, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. These most holy days celebrate the Paschal Mystery, first, the passion, suffering, and death of the Lord Jesus, followed by his resurrection, the triumph of the holy cross, and Christ's decisive victory over sin and death. The Triduum is a single feast, the Paschal Mystery, celebrated over three days.

HOLY THURSDAY – March 28th

The evening Mass on Holy Thursday is referred to as The Mass of the Lord's Supper. This is where the Church re-lives the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified.

After the homily there is an optional "washing of the feet" ceremony, where the priest washes the feet of others to signify his role as servant—just as Jesus did with his disciples. Extra hosts are consecrated at this Mass to be used on Good Friday when no Mass will be celebrated.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "altar of repose," a place where the consecrated Host is kept, away from the main altar where Mass is normally celebrated.

Many parishes will create space for people to stay and pray with the reposed Eucharist at this altar of repose late into the night, remembering Jesus' request in the Garden of Gethsemane for someone to "watch and pray" with Him.

GOOD FRIDAY – March 29th

Good Friday is a mandatory day of fasting and abstinence. This is the day of the crucifixion, the day Jesus died for the sins of the world.

The parish altar looks very different on Good Friday: it is plain and bare. There is no consecrated Host in the tabernacle at the main altar of the church; it was carried away on Holy Thursday night to the "altar of repose" to signify Jesus' death. The candle by the tabernacle is blown out, and the tabernacle doors are left open to show that it is empty. Jesus is gone. This is quite dramatic, reminding us that Good Friday is a solemn day of mourning and prayer. The ceremony on Good Friday is not a Mass—it is a communion service using the consecrated hosts from Holy Thursday. Good Friday is the only day of the year on which no Masses are offered.

EASTER VIGIL – Saturday, March 30th

A vigil Mass is held after nightfall on Holy Saturday and is the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. This is called the Easter Vigil: the most glorious, beautiful, and dramatic liturgy for the Church. The vigil is divided into four parts: 1) the Service of Light, 2) the Liturgy of the Word, 3) the Liturgy of Baptism, and 4) the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

This is also the Mass in which many RCIA catechumens are brought into full communion with the Catholic Church.

The Easter Vigil begins at 7:00 p.m.

EASTER SUNDAY – March 31st

Easter Sunday is what we've all been waiting for! The forty days of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during Lent was in preparation for this day, when our hearts and souls can drink in deeply the culmination of the Paschal mystery: the Resurrection.

Mass of the Resurrection celebrated at 8:00 & 10:30 a.m. - Sorry, there will be no 5:00 p.m. Mass on Easter



Lenten Regulations

Following are the regulations for **abstinence** and **fasting** to be observed by Catholics during Lent:

A fast and abstinence is prescribed for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is observed by all Catholics between 18 and 59. Those bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid food between meals is not permitted.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on all Fridays of Lent.

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer, the church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe penitential days totally or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

1. Article format

Microsoft Word or Publisher are preferred. Typing an announcement or article into the body of an email is also acceptable. **Please send any accompanying images as separate email attachments** at the highest resolution possible. Acceptable image formats are JPG, TIF, or PNG.

2. Flyers

If you wish to submit a flyer, **please send a PDF instead of an image file.** If the flyer was created in Microsoft Word or Publisher, please submit it in that format, as well.

- a) Please note that because our bulletin has limited space available, we don't always have room to run full-page or even half-page flyers. On Seeing Something, and Saying Something

My wife and a friend were in charge of games for a recent Woman's Club meeting at my home parish. Gail was running late that night, so I loaded everything she'd packed up for the event into her car, then I offered to go with her to the parish hall to help her unload. We live less than a mile away from the hall, so with the unloading accomplished, I wished Gail well and began my leisurely walk home.

But I hadn't gone far when I saw something, and for the first time ever, I felt the need to say something. There's a bus stop on the west side of Austin just south of Lawrence. Walking past it headed north, I saw two unattended parcels on the bench. One was a small, fabric bag, maybe a backpack. The other was a small rectangular suitcase, and it appeared to be made of steel. Unusual, no? I thought so, anyway.

I would have called right then, but for one thing, I'd left my phone at home, and for two things, I didn't know exactly who to call. As soon as I could, I looked it up and per www.chicago.gov: "Residents are urged to call 855-RPRT-2S4 (855-777-8274)... to report any non-emergency suspicious activity to local authorities." I did, and the person on the other end got me in touch with someone else asking for details.

I told her what I've told you. I told her that I had noticed the unattended parcels maybe fifteen to twenty minutes earlier but had just now gotten to a phone. She asked if I'd heard any sound coming from the parcels, or if I'd seen any protrusions sticking out from them. I told her no. She said they'd look into it. All I know for sure is that when I drove past the bus stop the next morning, the parcels were gone.

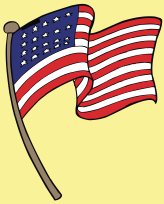
"If You See Something, Say Something.™" In a different context, it's interesting what people see and say in today's Gospel, the evangelist Mark's account of the Passion. Certain chief priests and scribes see a woman anoint Jesus's head with perfume and say, "It could have been sold for more than three hundred days' wages and the money given to the poor." Judas sees the religious elite secretly and says, "The man I shall kiss is the one; arrest him..." Peter sees people in the courtyard who link him to Jesus and says, "I do not know this man..." And passers-by see Jesus crucified and say "You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, save yourself by coming down from the cross."

In another "If You See Something, Say Something™" context, though, people see something and say something today to precisely point out the Christ. Isaiah's Suffering Servant sees something and says something in the first reading: "The Lord GOD is my help, therefore I am not disgraced" (Christian tradition identifies Jesus as the fulfillment of the Songs of the Suffering Servant). In the second reading, the Apostle Paul sees something and says something to the world: "Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave..." But I am particularly taken by what the centurion standing guard on Calvary says. He sees Jesus breathe his last and says, "Truly this man was the Son of God!" "If You See Something, Say Something™"? On this day, the centurion sees and says it all.

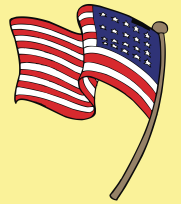
