

Did you notice anything odd in the Gospel this weekend? Jesus, a carpenter, gave instructions to the fisherman how to make a catch. Bold move Jesus. Bold move!

Peter could have thought: (a) I'm the expert here, You're a carpenter! You're no fisherman. (b) It's been a long night, we are tired, go away; (c) We tried: we've spent the whole night fishing. I'm done; (d) Fishing during the night is better (fish don't see the nets). What does this carpenter know? Fishing during the day is nonsense!

Honestly, the excuses could go on forever. And many of them would be valid. Simply put though, we just don't know what came to

Peter's mind. But we do know what he did: he obeyed. The same happened at the wedding feast of Cana when Our Lady said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." The servants obeyed and water was transformed into wine.

By obeying Jesus Christ you will have wine if you need wine, fish if you need fish, even bread for five thousand, if that's what you need.

The miracle in today's Gospel wasn't merely the amount of fish though. The miracle was the change in Peter and his companions. From that day on, after having obeyed Him, they stayed with Him for life, for death — and now, for eternity!

St. Josemaria Escriva wrote, "The power of obedience! The Lake of Gennesaret (Sea of Gallilee) had denied its fishes to Peter's nets. A whole night in vain. Then, obedient, he lowered his net again to the water and they caught 'a huge number of fish.' Believe me: the miracle is repeated each day" (The Way #629).

I, too, am firmly convinced that the miracle is repeated each and every day. The miracle of obedience in the Gospel is in a great catch of fish. But the even greater miracle is in the strength and faith of the Apostles. It's repeated in the strength and faith of us, Jesus' 21^{st} Century disciples. The miracle of obedience is shown in faith deeper than we ever imagined we could have when we place ourselves in God's arms in His Church. The miracle is in Christ's reassuring love and companionship guiding us along our lives. The miracle is in the fact that Jesus Christ — God Himself — is alive and, in the Church, He lives with us as our brother.
