A WORD FROM Fr. Ryan

The Gospel at Mass last Sunday showed us Jesus and the devil confronting one another in the desert. And today, on this Second Sunday of Lent, we move to Mount Tabor. We hear about our Lord's glorious Transfiguration. We should prayerfully place ourselves in the Gospel this weekend. We should be amazed at what takes place.

Just last week, while in the desert we saw Jesus, fully a man, sharing with us all things, even temptation. This week, on Mt. Tabor, we see Jesus, fully the Son of God. Here Jesus shares with us, mere humans, His divinity. These events seem to contradict each other. How can Jesus be fully human and fully divine?! Jesus is fully human and fully divine. And both events point us towards the Truth of the Paschal Mystery: By His life, death, and Resurrection, Jesus has purchased for us eternal salvation. He was tempted by the evil one.

He remained faithful to us, for us. And even in this world, the radiant light of Jesus' transfigured Body predicts the glory of the Resurrection – for Himself and for us.

The desert and the mountain are both isolated places. Solitude and silence seemingly reign in both. Moved by the Holy Spirit, Jesus withdrew to both desert and mountain in order to pray to our Father. Holy Scripture shows us that in those places, free of noise, God reveals Himself in a special way.

We should all follow Jesus' example. We all need space and times of silence where we can quiet the noise around us. We need a place where we can foster an interior recollection. We need a space and time of silence where the 'whisper' of God's still, soft voice is heard.

Exactly thirteen years ago, Pope Benedict reflected on the same readings we hear today and said: "Silence can carve out an inner space in our very depths to enable God to dwell there, so that his Word will remain within us and love for Him will take root in our minds and hearts and inspire our life."

Let's carve out a little place for silence and quiet. Here, let's let God reside within us. Here, in this place of interior calm, let God's Word take hold of you and move you to become a Saint!

It is normal to feel a certain fear of silence. We live in a very noisy world. Silence requires courage. Silence means going deep inside ourselves to discover the truth of our existence, who we are and who we are meant to be. It is also normal that, at first, it is difficult for us to temper the noise level when we strive for silence. Begin again. And, when you struggle the next time. Begin again, again. Persevere! When we continually strive for this quiet space within the daily hustle and bustle, the so often rapid pace of our daily life, we open a path to the presence of God. Our Lord often waits for our silence to reveal Himself.

"We need to find God, and God cannot be found in noise and restlessness. God is the friend of silence." St. Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa)

Lenten Regulations

Following are the regulations for **abstinence** and **fasting** to be observed by Catholics during Lent:

A fast and abstinence is prescribed for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is observed by all Catholics between 18 and 59. Those bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid food between meals is not permitted.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on all Fridays of Lent.

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer, the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe penitential days totally or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.
