

A WORD FROM Fr. Ryan

Usually, when I suggest that a person go to confession, I get the reply: "Listen, Father. I'm a good guy. I don't need confession. It's not like I've killed anyone." "My friend," I usually answer, "go anyways." Confession is not only for murderers. Confession is a gift from God. It's a gift from God for those who have lied and gossiped, for people who are lustful, lazy, vain, proud, ill-tempered, gluttonous, imprudent, dishonest, uncharitable... on and on. If I get that far with someone in my conversation about confession, they likely feel convicted somehow and are ready to go.

In the long list of things that we can do that separate us from God, how can we not prayerfully and quietly kneel in confession and pray: "Bless me father for I have sinned..."

Everyone has sins. Naturally then, everyone needs repentance. Another priestfriend came across a parishioner at the grocery store and reminded him that it was Lent, and that he should go to confession 'from time to time.' The man answered,

"But I don't have any sins, father." My priest-friend replied, "There are two kinds of people who have no sins, children and madmen. Which one are you?" It sounds a little harsh. But there's truth to it!

We are all called to constant conversion. That means moving beyond the things that keep us from God (our sins) and strengthening ourselves through the Sacraments (confession, Eucharist, etc.). The first step to conversion is recognizing our own sins. God, in His Mercy, is always ready to forgive our sins. God simply needs to find a repentant heart. As St. Augustine put it, "You accuse yourself: God excuses you. You excuse yourself: God accuses you."

President Teddy Roosevelt once held a position akin to the Superintendent of the New York Police Department. As a result, he was always interested in crime and criminal reform. Once, as President of the United States, he toured a big American city and Roosevelt asked to see the local prison. One after another, President Roosevelt asked inmates the reason for their imprisonment. They fell on their knees proclaiming their innocence: "There is a mistake, Mr. President, I am innocent!" "I didn't do what they said." "I don't belong here!" Finally, near the end of his visit, Roosevelt asked a man, "Why are you here?" The prisoner replied, "Armed robbery." Surprised, the President asked, "Are you guilty?" "Yes indeed, I deserve my punishment," said the man. The President then summoned the prison warden and ordered him, "Release this guilty wretch at once! Otherwise he will corrupt all the fine innocent people who live in this prison!"

Lenten Regulations

Following are the regulations for **abstinence** and **fasting** to be observed by Catholics during Lent:

À fast and abstinence is prescribed for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is observed by all Catholics between 18 and 59. Those bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid food between meals is not permitted.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on all Fridays of Lent.

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer, the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe penitential days totally or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.
