

The two weeks since Easter have been quite momentous. Obviously, on Easter Monday, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, closed his eyes to this world for the last time. Then, on Easter Wednesday, in the early hours of the morning Captain David Meyer of the Chicago Fire Department lost his life responding to a fire on our City's West Side.

The following week, the world turned its eyes to Rome as Pope Francis was buried in a beautiful Mass in St. Peter's Square. Again, just days later, the eyes of our city turned to St. John Brébeuf Church as the Meyer Family, the CFD Family, and the family that is our City mourned the loss of Captain Meyer in a touching moment of prayer.

Life is filled with uncertainties. But one certainty is inescapable: death. There's an old saying "memento mori" — "remember you will die." It seems a pretty somber principle, but it's the bedrock of a life in prayer. Yet, at the same

time this certainty also brings a certain hope for those who, with a loving heart, have striven to live as God longs for them to live.

Remember, we are an Easter People! We know that Jesus Christ has risen from the dead. Jesus has conquered death! And, with Him, so too shall we. As people of faith, we know that while our earthly bodies will die, death no longer has any sting for those who profess the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who conquered death once and for all.

And still, losing a loved one is not easy. Our faith reassures us that, in Heaven, we will be reunited with those for whom we mourn. We still mourn for those we've lost and cherish the memories that remain in our hearts. Let us always have faith. And let us never lose hope.

Let us pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis. And let us pray for ourselves, all Catholics. We've lost a father, a leader, our shepherd. Although Francis has died, Peter still lives. The Pope is the successor to St. Peter. Peter, through the pope, lives as long as the Church lives. Let us pray then for those 134 Cardinals who will convene in the coming week to elect the next Peter, our Pope.

Let us pray also for the response of the soul of Captain David Meyer. Let us pray for his wife Kristen, his four children, his parents, his brother, his friends. And let us pray for ourselves also. Let us strengthen each other as another member of our first responder family has died tragically and senselessly. Let us strengthen each other through our prayer.

This may sound odd at first, but let's rejoice too! St. Paul wrote to the people of Thessalonica something that should ring in our ears these days: "We do not want you to be unaware, brothers, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep" (1 Thess. 4:13-14). Let's not grieve like the rest, those who don't have the hope of Jesus Christ in their life. Let us mourn with the trust in God to hope, always. Jesus Christ, our Lord and brother, has conquered all things, including death itself.

Let us pray that our Lord welcome home Francis and Dave, our brothers. And let us call out to God asking Him to intercede and protect our next Pope (whomever he may be). And, let us call out to God asking Him to intercede and protect all members of the Chicago Fire Department, and all first responders across our city and country.


