A WORD FROM Fr. Ryan

In this weekend's Gospel, an excited young man runs up to Jesus. Jesus was moved by the young man's good dispositions. The Gospel tells us that "Jesus looking at him, loved him." And yet for this young man, there was just "one more thing" to do. It is likely that if Jesus had asked him to give alms or to volunteer some of his time to people in need, the young guy would have been happy to oblige. But Our Lord asked for something the man wasn't ready to give: all his possessions. So the young man went away sad. Sadness is the result of not being generous with God.

"When I see someone sad," St. Teresa of Calcutta taught, "I always think, she is refusing something to Jesus." Mother Teresa understood in an incredible way that generosity and joy come together. St. Paul explains it in his letter to the Corinthians: "Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each must do as already determined, without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Corinthians 9:6-7) A cheerful giver is generous. A "grudging giver" is defeated, dull, lifeless. Saints are cheerful givers. Saints, then, are always happy and their joy becomes a magnet that brings other souls to Jesus Christ.

There was a non-Catholic girl who went to Holy Mass for the first time with a friend. She didn't know much of anything about the Mass. All she knew was that at some point someone would come by with a basket and collect money. So this young, non-Catholic girl brought a few coins with her. During the homily, she got a bit distracted (it happens) and started playing with the coins. Suddenly one of them slipped from her fingers and hit the floor with a noise. She was a bit embarrassed when people turned to her; but her embarrassment became panic when she saw that the coin had begun rolling down the aisle towards the astonished priest.

The tense silence was broken by the sudden laughter of the priest. The priest interrupted his homily to say, "I can't tell if she's excited for the collection or not-so-subtly telling me it's time to end my homily!" In a second, the whole congregation joined the priest in a raucous laughter! That young girl never forgot the spontaneous reaction of those Catholics and the joy they had. She imagined the priest would be stiff and boring. She imagined that Mass would be a chore. She never imagined herself laughing at Mass! Yet, the people she encountered were joyful and generous. She was attracted to what was going on there. And... before the year was out, she was at Mass weekly and had converted to the Church.

In today's Gospel, Jesus says: "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." All things are possible for God. Our growth in holiness is possible for God. Our growth in happiness is possible for God. Jesus looks at us, and He loves us. Let us then be a "cheerful giver." Let us give Jesus Christ our whole heart and trust that the return on that investment will be Paradise!

Possessions

When I was a kid, before smartphones and Amazon, it was the toy catalogs that we waited for.

They arrived in the mail, smiling children's faces splashed across the cover, like a silent promise that real happiness could be purchased within these magical pages. We fought over who got to look at them first. We imagined playtime with this Barbie or that EasyBake Oven.

Without realizing it, we expected that these toys — and the fun they would create out of thin air, the excitement they would inject into our days — would give us new lives. Make us new people.

The toys we did get were fun enough, but they never made us new people. They never gave us new lives. And before long they broke or needed new batteries. They lost their allure, and they went to the attic. And then, many years later, when we got married or moved houses, we found them, and we sighed — more junk to get rid of.

It's the same now, thirty years later, as much as I hate to admit it. The catalogs have become social media, and the toys have become promotions or pay raises or home improvement projects. I scroll through the feed and my mind lights up. *What if we had this? What if we could buy that? What if we could go there?*

The rich young man was not sad as he walked away from Jesus because he was losing his riches. He was sad because he wasn't — because he *couldn't*. He couldn't give them up. Such is the dark magic of materialism: it takes hold when you're not looking. He thought he was being a good person and doing good things. But he had given his heart away, and he hadn't given it to God. And now he couldn't get it back.

Whatever of this world we seek to possess — dollars, cars, clothes, prestige — will come to possess us, in the end.

On the Jordache Look, the Victoria Principle, and Eternal Life

I saw a comic strip decades ago that I've never forgotten, probably in the 1980s, when Jordache jeans and Jordache in general were all the rage. It was one of those single-panel comics, and it showed a rather frumpy-looking man wearing a rather frumpy-looking (and ill-fitting) suit. The man was gazing at himself in a full-length mirror, as was the other person in the picture, the store salesperson. The man in the ill-fitting suit seemed sad as the store clerk said something like this to him: "You don't understand, sir. You can't *have* the Jordache look..."

At roughly the same time, I became aware of another clever line that has also stayed with me, but I do not recall if this was in a comic strip or an article or maybe even a celebrity's story on a late-night talk show. Anyway, the TV series *Dallas* was popular at the time, as was one of the show's sexy stars, Victoria Principal. In the comic strip/article/story, a woman was unhappy because she couldn't improve her looks, despite her efforts to be glamorous. When she demanded to know why, someone explained to her, "It's the Victoria Principle..."

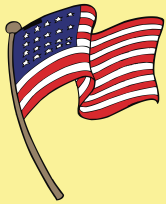
I love these two lines because we can probably all think of times when we could have applied them in our own lives. Sometimes, precisely *what* we want is not available to us. Now, I know what the *Rolling Stones* say. The *Rolling Stones* say, "You can't always get what you want/ But if you try sometimes, well, you might find/ You get what you need." True enough, I suppose. Still, the lines keep playing in my head ("You can't *have* the Jordache look..." and "It's the Victoria Principal") and I think about them now in relationship to that man in today's Gospel who runs up to Jesus, kneels before him, and asks, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

We're all familiar with this one. Jesus responds, "...You know the commandments: *You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother.*" The man — perhaps hopeful at this moment — answers, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." More or less, we can probably all answer the same. But then Jesus adds this: "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me," and the man's optimism fades.

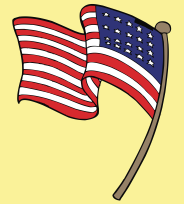
Because the man has many possessions, perhaps he says to himself, "*I cannot do that*" (the Victoria Principle and/or "You can't *have* the Jordache look"). Either way, he goes away sad, prompting Jesus to tell his friends, "...How hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." The disciples are amazed at this and wonder, "Then who can be saved?" And Jesus's response should embolden all of us — even the man with many possessions — to see ourselves in Paradise: "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." It's the God Principle. Jordache look or no.

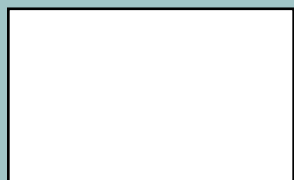
