A WORD FROM Fr. Ryan

This weekend, I'm using this space to announce a change coming to St. Christina Parish. For twelve years, this parish has come to enjoy the weekly split-the-pot in the weekend collection. I'm also well aware that neighboring parishes have weekly split-the-pot in their weekend collection. This was once considered an innovative way of raising funds and bringing people to Mass.

One of the five precepts of the Church is to help provide for the material needs of the Church. This is typically done in the Sunday collection. Therefore, the collection at Mass should always be a free-will offering. Giving at Mass with the expectation of reward through gambling robs us of the ability to provide a free-will offering. With split-the-pot, our offering becomes gambling, plain and simple. And gambling at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is something we shouldn't do.

In the Catholic Church, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the re-presentation of Calvary, where Christ was Crucified. Jesus Christ is truly present on the altar. Weekly, at Mass, Jesus is exposed and sacrificed for us once again. There are many places for games, split-the-pot, or raffles, but Mass isn't one of them.

After consultation with parishioners, parish staff, parish organizations, clubs, and the parish Finance Council, I have decided that we will discontinue the split-the-pot raffle on the Solemnity of Christ the King, November 24th. After the weekend collection of November 23rd & 24th, we will continually pull tickets until a final split-the-pot winner is selected.

I know this may be an unwelcome change to some. I am sorry for that. I assure you that I have prayed, discerned, and sought advice before making the decision to eliminate the split-the-pot. This is not a fund-raising decision. This is not a decision based on participation. This is a decision based on maintaining the dignity and sanctity of the Holy Mass. Plain and simple, a split-the-pot in the collection is gambling at Mass. And that's something we shouldn't continue.

"Now," you may ask, "what will I ever do with that weekly \$5 I used to put in split-the-pot?!" You can give your weekly split-the-pot money to the parish as a free will offering in the Sunday collection. You can give to the monthly "Support Your Parish" blue envelope, which provides you the ability to direct your contribution to a specific parish need or cause. Frankly, we are in need of both.

Or, if you'd prefer a game of chance, you might be happy to know that there will be a return of the parish **ST. CHRISTINA TREASURE CHEST RAFFLE!** You can save that weekly \$5 from split-the-pot and purchase one (or more) of the limited St. Christina Treasure Chest Raffle tickets for **a chance to win \$50,000!**

And when will we draw the \$50,000 Treasure Chest Raffle ticket? We will pull the Treasure Chest Raffle ticket at the **Feast of St. Christina Parish Picnic to be held on Saturday, July 26th.**

After consultation, I discovered that there is a great desire for a return of our parish picnic. On July 26, 2025 we will have a special Mass in honor of our Parish Patron, St. Christina. At the conclusion of an 11:00 a.m. Mass, our statue of St. Christina will be hoisted on the shoulders of parishioners and lead us in procession from our Church to St. Christina Fields. Our parish picnic will have many games, attractions, and opportunities to sing and dance. Most importantly though, it will be an occasion to gather as one, pray together, then have a blast with each other. Stay tuned!

My hope is that the Treasure Chest raffle can give us the chance to continue the source of revenue from split-the-pot albeit in a more proper context and place. Also, importantly, the return of the picnic will give us a place to bring our parish and school family together for a fun and enjoyable occasion.

The Hardness of Your Hearts

As far as I know, no one has ever woken up in the morning, looked out the window, and thought, “This is a beautiful sunrise. I’ll have to be very careful not to let it make me happy.”

But I’m certain that every day, lots of people — including, on not-infrequent occasions, myself — have woken up and remembered something that happened the day before. Something that made us feel upset or frustrated or insulted. And we thought to ourselves, “That makes me so, so angry.” And we’ve pictured the face of the person who made us feel that way, and we have scoffed with disgust.

And we hold onto that anger because anger feels so much better than sadness. And deep within ourselves, in the place where we feel all the love and pain and confusion that is inherent in human existence, we harden.

Nobody ever intends to be hard-hearted. That’s just the stuff of Bond villains and horror flicks. No, in real life a hardened heart isn’t a conscious choice. It’s a reflex. It’s just us trying to protect ourselves, to be strong — or, at least, to embody the version of strength offered by a fallen world.

A heart of stone is not so easily scratched, you see. But it’s also not so easily warmed or touched or moved.

A heart hardened by resentment and pain and anger is not just protected from injury. It is protected from the impact of the whole spectrum of tender feelings. It is not open to forgiveness, so it cannot feel the rush of life-giving mercy. It is closed off to new ideas, so it can never feel the awe of discovery.

There is a reason we are called to guard ourselves against hard-heartedness. God gave us hearts of flesh and blood. They are hearts that can be broken, yes — but also, they are hearts that can be made new.

St. Christina Parish Domestic Violence Outreach



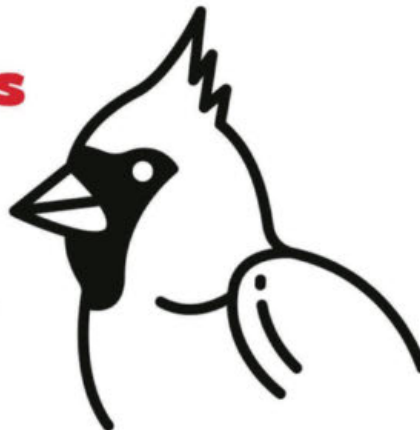
