A WORD FROM Fr. Ryan

Beginning Monday, I will be on a week-long silent retreat. Each year a priest is called to make a retreat. To be clear: retreat is not a vacation. For the priest, a retreat is a response to the call to “come ... and rest a while” (Mk 6:31). The priest’s annual retreat is a life force for spiritual survival.

Canon law states that priests “are equally bound to make time for spiritual retreats according to prescripts of particular law” (Canon 276.2.4). A priest **MUST** make an annual retreat. Yet, many ignore this requirement. Without the spiritual renewal afforded in retreat, a priest will be beaten down and burnt out. A priest without retreat will be no good to himself and no good to his parishioners. “You will know them by their fruit” (Mt 7:16).

The priest’s obligation to make an annual retreat is truly no obligation at all. It is an opportunity. The silence and time spent with brother priests is life-giving. While on retreat, I will peacefully spend time with Jesus and be nourished by Him. I need this to become a better man and priest for you.

While on retreat, I will be praying for each and every parishioner of St. Christina Parish. Sadly, many won’t know I’m on retreat. Many parishioners I’ve never met. Many probably don’t even know who I am. The reason being is that they aren’t around. They aren’t active members of the parish. They aren’t actively living out our Faith. I will be praying, fasting, and mortifying my own desires on this retreat for the return of all St. Christina parishioners who do not practice our Faith.

At St. Christina, we have 2,400 registered families numbering nearly 8,500 souls. Yet last week, we had fewer than 800 people at our four weekend Masses. Now, I understand the Bears were playing an early 8:30 a.m. game that conflicted with Sunday Mass times. But the Bears can’t even get us into the playoffs, let alone Heaven. Well over 7,000 souls in this parish missed out on the opportunity to receive the greatest gift Jesus can give us on this side of Heaven: His very Body in the Blessed Sacrament.

Jesus Christ is greedy! Jesus Christ is greedy for souls. He wants each and every soul in this parish to receive Him in the Blessed Sacrament. He wants each and every soul in this parish to be a saint. I understand that it may be difficult to get to Mass because of ill health or scheduling conflicts. But if you are able to make it to the grocery store or doctor’s office to feed and care for your body, you should be able to make it to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass to feed and care for your soul.

If you don’t drive and need a ride, give me a call. We’ll get a ride situated for you. If you are physically unable to come, let us know and we can come to you. We will pray with you and bring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to your home.

If you’re physically able and not coming, come home. Jesus is waiting for you. And please, let’s encourage all our friends and family to come home to Church. Come home to St. Christina where Jesus awaits us at every Mass. Let’s also pray, fast, and mortify our desires so that we may grow in holiness and for the benefit of the souls of those we sacrifice for.

This week, close to Jesus in the silence of retreat, be assured of my prayers for you and all those whom you love.

We Celebrate

On Thursday, November 2nd during the 7:00 p.m. Mass in church, we will have a memorial of our faithful departed. Our memorial service will take place immediately following the homily of the Mass. The names of parishioners and those buried from St. Christina Church since last October 26, 2023 will be read.

Upon your arrival for Mass on All Souls Day you will receive a candle having the name of your deceased loved one. You and your family will then bring the candle up into the sanctuary and place it on the table which has been prepared on the Blessed Mother side, and there it will be lit. ***It will be important to be in church before 7:00 p.m. to allow time for family members to bring their candle up into the sanctuary before Mass starts.***

If you would also like to have a photo of your loved one placed in the sacred space during November, you may bring the photo when you come for a weekend Mass or a morning Mass and place it in one of the marked containers in the vestibule of the church. (*Containers will be available starting October 19th*). Photos may also be dropped off at the rectory. Please be sure to put the name on the back, along with your phone number. If you bring a picture with you on November 2nd, simply bring it up to the ladies in front. You are then welcome to leave the picture and candle in church until November 24th, or you may take them with you after Mass on November 2nd. How fitting to then have the candle in a place of honor for your Thanksgiving Day celebration, on the dining room table or in an appropriate setting.

We invite you, your family, and anyone who wishes, to please join us in praying for and remembering our deceased loved ones. While we no longer experience their physical presence with us, our faith tells us we will one day be reunited. Life has changed for them, for their earthly journey is completed and they are at peace. In communion with them, we journey forward in faith. Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,



St. Christina Parish Domestic Violence Outreach



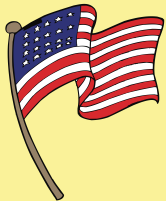

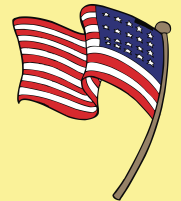
